# Organists have such imaginations! See this Organist e-mail banter commenting on the St. John's Lutheran Dedication Concert:



**Organist 1:** That really was a nice dedication, too. It was particularly poignant for me as our church is probably approaching a major organ overhaul as well. Nice to see others have overcome some large hurdles!

**Organist 2:** Let's see . . . The headline will read: "Clifton's 5-manual 150-rank organ is now the largest instrument east of Westminster Presbyterian Church." Going on . . . "the Master Organ Grinder was stunning in his fashionable gold lamé ensemble, assembled in the Yellow Springs community by former Antioch hippies."

**Organist 1:** Better add . . . "and the new building required to house the slightly larger instrument (9 ranks to 150), resembles Notre Dame, but was constructed completely from locally quarried limestone".

**Organist 1:** Actually major for us is re-leathering the 1917 wind chests and correcting what I hope is a couple of nasty console issues . . . a big bill in a small church!

# St. John's Lutheran Church Has Pipe Organ Dedication

Yes, St. John's Lutheran Church definitely has pipe organ dedication. In spite of a series of daunting obstacles and setbacks, St. John's teamed with Larry Stofer's Rainbow Organ Company to complete the musical vision for the church organ begun by David Weingartner. The



effort culminated in a wonderful instrument and the dedication service held Sunday, August 29.

### As The Service Began

The sanctuary was filled to overflowing when the masterful dedication organist, Mr. **David Comer** began to play. Comer is the organist at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Oakwood and holds degrees in music from Capital, Northwestern and Indiana Universities. He began with "An Organ Fanfare for St John's" composed by nationally known composer and Dayton artist **Gilbert M. Martin** — who also served as Comer's page turner! Written specifically to celebrate this organ, the fanfare highlighted the burnished copper pipes and trumpets which were the pride of the church's late music director and the original force behind the organ, **David Weingartner**.



# The organ

A beautiful, gallery instrument distributes 45 stops over three manuals and floating choir and echo divisions. The 17 pedal stops are composed of pedal

unique, coupled and a few digital ranks. The refurbished console looks out over the sanctuary and has tilting tablets for both stops and couplers.



### Showcase for Many Voices

The dedication was a showcase for many voices — those of the organ, choir and congregation. Music Director Jeffrey Powell directed the choir voices in the moving anthem "Arise, My Soul, Arise," which he composed for the dedication. Elizabeth Campbell Buckley, mezzo soprano and Mark Hofeldt, cellist, performed "Pie Jesu" from Duruflé Requiem. These two outstanding musicians were accompanied by some of the more subtle voices of the organ. Mr. Comer gave an organ recital which displayed the range of color in the instrument. Selections included works by Bach, Hebble and the finale of Vierne's first organ symphony.

## The Final Hymn, the Final Word!!

Pastor Jeffrey Campbell's homily asked why we should bother with the effort and expense of a pipe organ. In part he answered with Psalms, "Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre... praise him with resounding cymbals. Let everything that has breathe praise the lord" (Psalm 150:3-6). He reaffirmed that, pronouncing if the organ were silenced the walls and pews would sing out. But the final hymn had the final word with resounding combination of this wonderful new organ and congregation thundering: "Now let all who hear to his temple draw near, Joining in glad adoration". That is why we bother!

Congratulations to the congregation of St. John's, to the organ project manager, **Derek Maddox**, and to **Lawrence Stofer** and the Rainbow Organ Company. Well Done! Another excellent organ for the Dayton area and the worship of God.
