At Carnegie Hall, gospel singer Wintley Phipps delivers perhaps the most powerful rendition of Amazing Grace ever recorded. He says, "A lot of people don't realize that just about all Negro spirituals are written on the black notes of the piano. Probably the most famous on this slave scale was written by John Newton, who used to be the captain of a slave ship, and many believe he heard this melody that sounds very much like a West African sorrow chant. And it has a haunting, haunting plaintive quality to it that reaches past your arrogance, past your pride, and it speaks to that part of you that's in bondage. And we feel it. We feel it. It's just one of the most amazing melodies in all of human history." After sharing the noteworthy history of the song, Mr. Phipps delivers a stirring performance that brings the audience to its feet!

#### From the Keyboard Interest Area:

With the dawning of a new year, consider these ideas for 2012:

- 1. **Find a challenging piece** you've wanted to learn. Break it down into sections, and set goals for completing each.
- 2. Look through your library for an **old repertoire favorite** that has been neglected. Dig it out and incorporate it into your plans for this year.
- 3. Look through your library for **gems you've never played**. We're usually amazed at pieces that have escaped our attention.
- 4. **Evaluate your hymn playing**. Where could your skills be enhanced? Set goals for bringing new life to your ministry of leading your congregation at the keyboard.
- 5. How are your staff relations? What small steps could you take to enhance these? Take a moment to write notes of appreciation, make lunch dates, or drop unexpected small gifts in their staff mailboxes. Assure them of your prayers.
