


AGO Region V Convention Kalamazoo, MI

Nine members and friends of the Dayton Chapter of the AGO attended the 2013 Region V Convention in Kalamazoo and Battle Creek, Michigan. The Radisson Plaza Hotel served as home base in Kalamazoo with the concerts and workshops held at the many beautiful churches clustered around Bronson Park.



The convention committee put together a broad array of venues, music and organs ranging from the Kalamazoo Ringers at St Luke's Episcopal (left/center) to the Quimby Young Organist winner recital on the striking First Presbyterian Casavant Freres, 69 Rank organ (right).








The church architectures were beautiful and varied as were the organs which ranged from historic Skinners to the 67 rank, 1998 Orgues Letourneau at the First Baptist Church (Center/Right)







The concerts of the last day were held in Battle Creek – home of the W. K. Kellogg and family foundation. Mr. Kellogg was an advocate of E. M. Skinner's organs and was responsible for many organs heard on the last day including the St Thomas Episcopal 1929 Skinner (center) that is quite simillar to the organ in the Dayton Art Institute. The Choral Academy, including our own **John Priebe**, sang under the direction of Joe Miller at St Philip Catholic Church accompanied by a 1930 Skinner.







I may be biased, but my personal favorite convention event was the concert given by our own **Yun Kim** on the 61 rank, 1928 Skinner in the First Presbyterian church, Battle Creek. From the church to console to façade pipes, this was an impressive venue.







But the venue was just the beginning. Yun's program included Vierne, Prokofiev and was topped off with the *Fiesta! Suite* for Organ Solo by Farrington. It's simply amazing how time after time Yun puts together such varied and interesting programs – and then makes virtuosity look easy. We were very happy to get a picture with Yun after her recital.
