# Kevin Vaughn Recital at St. George's Episcopal Church

Dr. Vaughn played an outstanding recital on October 30<sup>th</sup> at St. George's Episcopal Church. The concert was sponsored by the Dayton Chapter of the AGO and hosted by St. Georges Organist, Jeff Powell. After Kevin recently graduated from Notre Dame with a DMA, he contacted the Dayton Chapter about playing a concert honoring one of his former teachers, Chapter member, Ms. Phyllis Warner. Phyllis helped Kevin start his organ career at Cedarville University. He was also awarded a Dayton Chapter scholarship under past Dean Yun Kim. Kevin was very grateful for the encouragement and support of the Dayton Chapter and its members. The Chapter is very proud to have had a role in the nurturing of this talented young organist.



Kevin's recital ranged from Bach to Litaize whose music was the subject of his doctoral dissertation. The recital was played and tailored to the St. George's wonderful Fiske tracker organ. He was assisted by Chapter member Matt Hunt who pulled the manual stops and turned pages. Kevin joined Chapter members and friends for an informal dinner after the concert giving members time to discuss the recital, his career and reminisce about his time with us in Dayton.

Dr. Vaughn is Director of Music and Organist at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in South Bend, Indiana; Instructor of Organ at Goshen College, Goshen, Indiana; and Adjunct Assistant Professor of Piano and Organ at the University of Notre Dame. He performs regularly as a solo organ recitalist and also appears in collaborative programs of sacred music for voice and organ with baritone Stephen Lancaster.

Kevin was a semifinalist in the 2013-2014 cycle of the National Young Artist Competition in Organ Performance sponsored by the American Guild of Organists, and, in February 2015, he won first prize in the Immanuel Lutheran Church Organ Scholar Competition in Evanston, Illinois. He holds undergraduate and graduate degrees in piano, organ, and sacred music, including the first Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance conferred by the University of Notre Dame (May 2016). His former teachers include Phyllis Warner, Gail Walton, and Craig Cramer. An active member of the American Guild of Organists, Kevin currently serves as Dean of the St. Joseph Valley (IN) Chapter and holds the Guild's Colleague certificate.
