

## The Organ Registration Workshop was presented by Dr. David Crean

On Sunday, November 4<sup>th</sup>, **Dr. David Crean** presented a fantastic **Organ Registration Workshop at** Wittenberg University's Weaver Chapel.

David is simply a fount of organ knowledge. David gave some great tips and tricks of organ registration, but it was the mix of registration with organ history that made this presentation so fascinating. David started in the 1500's and then discussed Spanish, Italian, German and French organs all the way through to the modern American organ. For each time and country, he provided organ specifications and discussed the organ, its resources, composers, music and registrations.



He talked in detail about both capabilities and limitations of each of the organs. To drive his points home, he concluded by playing examples of music and representative registrations from each period.

After the program many of the attendees went to Young's Jersey Dairy for dinner and ice cream. Literally the "cherry on top" of a great program!

#### About the Artists:



Concert organist Yun Kyong Kim is widely hailed for her vibrant performances and is passionate about presenting engaging programs of diverse musical styles to her audiences. Concert reviewers have described her performances as "remarkable" (The American Organist), "uniquely spectacular" (Hope College Anchor), and that she "plays with great sensitivity and great élan" (The Diapason). Recent engagements have included solo performances at the Piccolo Spoleto Festival, Washington National Cathedral, historic Skinner organs at Stambaugh Auditorium (Youngstown, OH), Holy Rosary Cathedral (Toledo, OH) and Hope College (Holland, MI), Methuen Memorial Music Hall (Methuen, MA), Ohio University and Miami University

performing arts series, and as a featured recitalist at two National Conventions of the Organ Historical Society and at two Region V Conventions of the American Guild of Organists. Her performances have been broadcast nationally on Pipedreams and Seattle Public Radio's From the Organ Loft.

After completing undergraduate organ study with Carole Terry at the University of Washington, Yun received both her master's and doctoral degrees in organ performance with minors in early music and music theory from Indiana University, where her principal teachers were Christopher Young and Elisabeth Wright. She has also studied and performed in North Germany and France, and made her French debut in Paris at Sainte-Clotilde. She is honored to be the 2015 recipient of the Distinguished Alumni Award from the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University.

Dr. Kim is a prize winner at both regional and national competitions in organ performance sponsored by the American Guild of Organists, and has served as an adjudicator at regional AGO conventions and the Fort Wayne National Organ Competition. She is currently the Competition Coordinator for the Great Lakes AGO Region. She is past Dean of the Dayton (Ohio) Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, has served on the faculty of three Pipe Organ Encounter programs for teens, and has chaired the Dayton Church Music Workshop. She is on the faculty at Sinclair Community College and serves as organist and choirmaster at Christ Episcopal Church in Dayton, Ohio.

Yun's brand new CD, *Wild Card*, has just been released on the Raven label. Her earlier CD, *Of Another Time*, is also available on the MSR Classics label. Please visit her website at yunkyongkim.com for more information.



**Elaina McCormick** holds a Master of Music Education from Bowling Green State University and a Master of Conducting from the American Band College of Sam Houston State University. ## Visit the Dayton AGO Music Library

The music is arranged by composer for much of the work but also has groups organized by holiday, collections, anthology, wedding music, sheet music and lots of monthly's like the Organ Portfolio.

The library is open to everyone. Just stop in and peruse the music. Take what you would like to use and leave a donation. We highly encourage teachers (and students) to use the library. There is a lot of the standard literature for study spanning all levels of difficulty.
