Priscilla Acuff's 8th Biennial Pedals, Pipes and Pizza

The Dayton AGO led by Priscilla Acuff completed its 8th biennial Pedals, Pipes, and Pizza on Saturday February 2nd at the Dayton Masonic Center. 53 students participated, and many parents, grandparents and other adults came to watch.

The event began with Priscilla Acuff playing the four manual, 59 rank E. M. Skinner pipe organ. She played selections of different styles and concluded with Andrew Lloyd Webber's Phantom of the Opera music. The phantom, played by Dan Acuff, did make an appearance.



A video produced by the American Guild of Organists titled Close Encounters was shown. It described the opportunities and experiences of the "Pipe Organ Encounters" offered to older youth during the summers.

This was followed by three different activities. Students attended a pipe organ science class lead by Dr. Yun Kim, participated in an organ crawl led by Dick Krewson and Matt Hunt, and best of all got to play a piece on the big E M Skinner organ in the auditorium.

The event concluded with pizza for Lunch. As a memento of the PPP, students were given a pipe organ stop key chain made by Dick Krewson. They also received a delicious "pipe" - a pretzel rod dipped in chocolate covered with colorful sprinkles made by Priscilla Acuff and her sister, Marty Piatt.







After the PPP officially concluded, some youth and adults took a tour of the Masonic Center including its many astounding lodges and pipe organs. Some of the other young potential organists stayed and played the auditorium organ or the 3rd floor organ. The students enjoyed playing the big organs so much that the last students did not leave until 2:50.

He also serves as Organ Scholar at Christ Church in New Haven.

The Dayton Chapter has a growing music "library" that is currently housed at the Westminster Presbyterian Church. The library is primarily composed of organ literature, but has piano works, choral music and method books as well. The music is arranged by composer for much of the work but also has groups organized by holiday, collections, anthology, wedding music, sheet music and lots of monthly's like the Organ Portfolio.

The library is open to everyone. Just stop in and peruse the music. Take what you would like to use and leave a donation. We highly encourage teachers (and students) to use the library. There is a lot of the standard literature for study spanning all levels of difficulty.

To access the library, visit Westminster on a weekday. Enter through the Office door on the east side of the church and let the administrator know you would like to go up and review music in the AGO library. It is on the 3rd Floor in room 301.
