John's Bio: The American choral conductor and organist, John Neely, grew up in Western Pennsylvania and has been active in the Presbyterian Church all his life. He holds degrees from Duquesne University, Union Theological Seminary School of Sacred Music, and Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. He is an ordained Presbyterian minister.

John Neely has taught in the music departments of at Washington and Jefferson College in Washington, Pennsylvania, and at Mt. Union College in Alliance, Ohio. In 1981 he moved to Dayton, Ohio and became



Associate Minister for Music at Westminster Presbyterian Church in downtown Dayton. A superb organist and choral director, under his leadership Westminster Church has an active music program for all ages with five singing choirs and three handbell choirs. Westminster offers musical programs that nourish the entire region.

John Neely is one of the most renowned musicians in the Greater Dayton region. He has been Music Director of the Bach Society of Dayton since its inception in 2002. His engaging personality, abundant musical skills, and ability to nurture musicians of varied ages make him the ideal musical leader of the Bach Society of Dayton.

John has been Dean of the Canton and Dayton Chapters of the American Guild of Organists and was National President of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians. He is active in the Dayton and surrounding areas as an organ recitalist, choral clinician, and is Music Director of the Bach Society of Dayton. He got married in 2002 with Ruth. They are parents of two grown sons and four grandchildren, Micah, Zeke, Kennedy, and Miles.

"Mindful and Physical Aspects of Organ Practicing" by Dr. Michael Unger was a great program!

Dr. Unger gave an outstanding workshop on "mindful" organ practice. He started off with several quotes on practice. My favorite was by Paul Check who wrote, "Repetition is the mother of skill, so long as there's skill in the repetition." How many times have we practiced a difficult section by repeating or just playing through. You've got to do the extra work to improve. He based the next part of his presentation on the "Inner Game of Tennis", by Timothy Gallway.

Acording to Michael, Gallway had four steps of learning including:

Step 1: Observe the existing behavior nonjudgmentally.

Step 2: Visualize the desired outcome

Step 3: Let it happen – Trust yourself

Step 4: Nonjudgmental, calm observation of the result

And then repeat as needed

Paraphrasing the steps, constructively figure out what is going wrong, find the best method to improve, implement the improvement and trust yourself to implement them, and finally, reassess to see if you need to make additional changes.

Nonjudgmental, constructive reflection was a foundation for much of what he recommended. He finished up the evening with practical examples trying to implement the various techniques as members played. Michael was very personable and gave an enjoyable, informative very useful presentation. A few photos of the workshop follow.











Visit the Dayton AGO Music Library at Westminster

The Dayton Chapter has a growing music "library" that is currently housed at the Westminster Presbyterian Church. The library is primarily composed of organ literature, but has piano works, choral music and method books as well. The music is arranged by composer for much of the work but also has groups organized by holiday, collections, anthology, wedding music, sheet music and lots of monthly's like the Organ Portfolio. The library is open to everyone. Just stop in and peruse the music. Take what you would like to use and leave a donation. We highly encourage teachers (and students) to use the library. There is a lot of the standard literature for study spanning all levels of difficulty.

To access the library, visit Westminster on a weekday. Enter through the Office door on the east side of the church and let the administrator know you would like to go up and review music in the AGO library. It is on the 3rd Floor in room 301.


