And (3) a 1890 Frank Roosevelt Organ at Covenant Presbyterian in Springboro.

We finished up with dinner at Doubleday's Tavern which gave members a chance to catch up just before the Covid Shutdown began.



Luke Tegtmeier at Schantz Organ



Schantz Organ Company announces the recent appointment of Luke Tegtmeier as Service Manager. "I am honored to take on this role with such an historic company," Tegtmeier said.

In addition to building new organs and restoring historic organs across the country, Schantz Organ Company regularly maintains nearly 200 organs throughout Ohio and surrounding states. These instruments range from the large Skinner concert instrument at Severance Hall in Cleveland to a new instrument at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Cincinnati. They also maintain many small instruments in parish churches and residences all over the region.

Tegtmeier grew up near Orrville, and has fond memories of the 125th anniversary of Schantz. "I was in high school when Schantz had an Open House to celebrate their anniversary. I can remember being impressed at how much work goes into making a pipe organ when I toured the shop."

Tegtmeier when on to complete church music degrees from Valparaiso University and Luther Seminary. While a student at Valparaiso, he was a summer intern at the famous Henry Willis Company in Liverpool, England. After completing school, he held full-time music director positions at Episcopal and Lutheran churches in Minnesota before moving to Ohio. "I still enjoy playing for churches around the region – but I have to admit that I also enjoy getting an occasional Sunday morning off!"


Since starting at Schantz, his goal has been to grow the service department. "We have an incredible level of expertise about the pipe organ, and we could easily send two or three teams out on tuning trips every day. We also do everything we can to coordinate service trips to minimize travel costs to our clients."

Visit the Dayton AGO Music Library at Westminster

The Dayton Chapter has a growing music "library" that is currently housed at the Westminster Presbyterian Church. The library is primarily composed of organ literature, but has piano works, choral music and method books as well. The music is arranged by composer for much of the work but also has groups organized by holiday, collections, anthology, wedding music, sheet music and lots of monthlies like the Organ Portfolio. The library is open to everyone. Just stop in and peruse the music. Take what you would like to use and leave a donation. We highly encourage teachers (and students) to use the library. There is a lot of the standard literature for study spanning all levels of difficulty.

To access the library, visit Westminster on a weekday. Enter through the Office door on the east side of the church and let the administrator know you would like to go up and review music in the AGO library. It is on the 3rd Floor in room 301.
