Part-time: Program staff. Average 12 hours per week

Covenant Presbyterian Church is a mission-driven, inclusive community in downtown Springfield, Ohio. Covenant is seeking an organist to join our music program.

We offer a weekly traditional service at 10:30 am in our beautiful sanctuary. Covenant has a long tradition of quality music programs that enhance the worship experience and engage the community-at-large and a congregation that loves and appreciates good music. Our Schantz organ has 3046 pipes, three manuals, full pedalboard, and 56 ranks. It was built and installed in 1962 and is maintained by Peebles-Herzog, Inc.

This part-time position includes a weekly Sunday morning rehearsal and service and negotiable Thursday evening rehearsals.

The service music includes prelude, hymns, anthem, Doxology,

Gloria Patri, and postlude.

The organist is also responsible for evening holiday services as needed including Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Carols & Lights, Christmas Eve, and Christmas occurring on a Sunday. For additional compensation, the organist serves as the point of contact for weddings and funerals and, if requested, provides music for these services. Ability to play the piano is preferred. Full position description available upon request.

Education/Experience: Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance preferred or equivalent experience.

Salary range: Minimum \$24,000. Salary is commensurate with education and experience.

MEMBER HIGHLIGHT

Janet Burkett

If you had/have another career, please tell a little about that part of your life.

I graduated from UD in 2022 with a Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering. While in college, I worked for the Leek Pipe Organ Company in Berea, Ohio. This fulfilled my grade school desire to work with pipes organs. Shortly after graduating college, I start my full time position as an Associate Research Engineer at the UD Research Institute where I do materials research with the Multifunctional Structures and Materials Group. After moving to Dayton, I deeply missed building and repairing these magnificent instruments and started my own firm, Koch & Co. Pipe Organs. Our current project is the restoration of the 1860/1919 Koehnken/Wangerin organ at Holy Trinity Catholic Church.

What inspires you about your current or past organist positions?

Every day is a new adventure, whether playing solo works or accompanying a congregation. Working around challenges and successfully accompanying a full singing choir and congregation each week is an incredibly wonderful feeling.

What bits of advice would you give a beginning organist?

Make sure to familiarize yourself with the instrument you are playing. Learn what it does best. Listen to each stop before setting registration. Also, make sure to develop a good relationship with a local tuner, builder, or technician so you have someone you can turn to when unexpected issues arise.
